The Corvus Biska 2023

After a long break, Birka was back in full swing this year. It was good to see old friends again and shop. There of course was a variety of things that happened at Birka. Unfortunately for me I don't get to see a lot of it because I am a merchant. However one of my favorite things to sneak away for is to see the Fashion show. This year the Queens challenge was mythological creatures. Three lovely Ladies from our Riding stepped up to the challenge and came up with some pretty creativ outfits.

Deep in the woods of Cumberland, Maryland, dwelled a terrible creature- the Snallygaster. Germanic immigrants told stories of the Schneller-geist (fast ghost) that haunted their settlements. The Snallygaster was said to be terrible dragon like creature: half-bird, half-reptile, with a beak of metal that dangled wriggling tentacles. This fearsome monster was known to eat chickens and wayward children. The Appalachian Mountains, where the Snallygaster appears, are sisters to the Scottish Highlands. These old hills were once part of the same mountain range in Central Pangea. Garb is inspired by fashion of the British Isles in the 9th-11th C. Saxon gunna, tunica, and head rail in a color palette chosen to allow the Snallygaster to blend into the shadows of the woods. The tentacles were crafted from yarn hand-painted by Snallygaster Fibers in their Secret of the Ooze colorway.

My costume was inspired by the Waterhouse painting of Ulysses and the Sirens and similar illustrations portraying the Harpy/Siren. I wanted to use a similar color pallet to the Waterhouse painting, so I picked browns, tans, and blacks. I knew I wanted to incorporate a look of feathers but wanted to keep it plausible for the period, so I opted to make a dagged hood with layers to simulate feathered wings and take inspiration from 15th century styles. Each feather was a separate piece that was lined and turned, then added to the hood and sleeves. I also wanted to bring the feather motif into the rest of the look in case I happened to take the hood off. I added similar feather-shaped layers to the pin on sleeves in brown and black to contrast the black and cream color of the hood. After the garments were finished, I added some pop by making lucet cord to trim the hood in. And of course, the look could not be complete without harpy-esque feet, which was also a huge inspiration, so chicken leg socks were a must.

Scorpion Genie

This Birka fashion show garb was inspired by the legends of the Jinn, otherwise known as a genie, that presented as scorpions throughout medieval Arabia. The gown is a traditional hand embroidered Syrian gown, with a headscarf that is befitting of a genie, full of gold thread, gems and rhinestones which veils the genie from being fully visible. The headpiece is carved from floral Styrofoam & helmet concussion padding, glue and curtain rod wire. It was spray painted gold and then bejeweled from head to tail with bits and pieces of shimmering jewelry. Even the genie's skin, nails and toes glittered gold...this scorpion genie tossed golden edible wishes into the audience as she walked down the runway.
